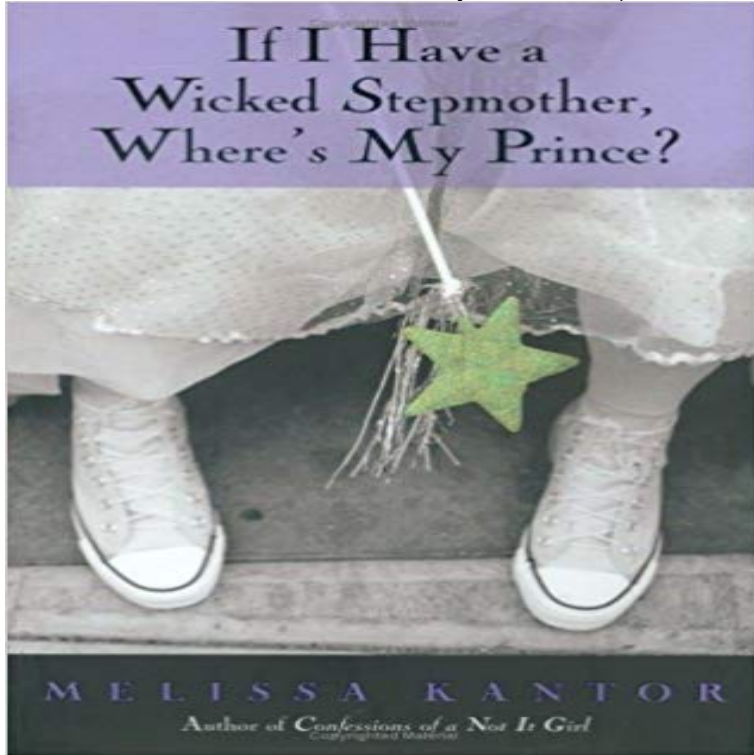


If I Have a Wicked Stepmother, Wheres My Prince?
