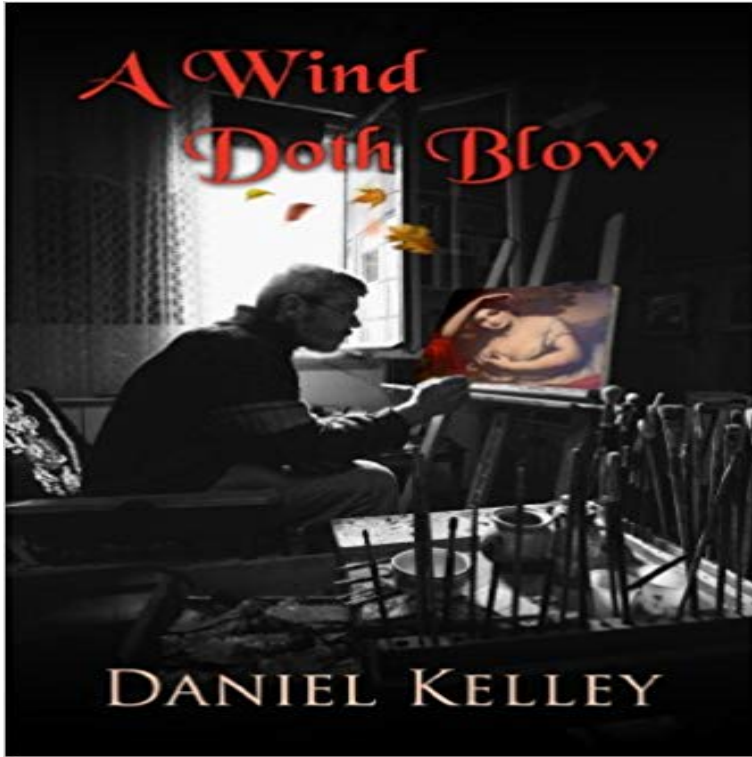


A Wind Doth Blow
