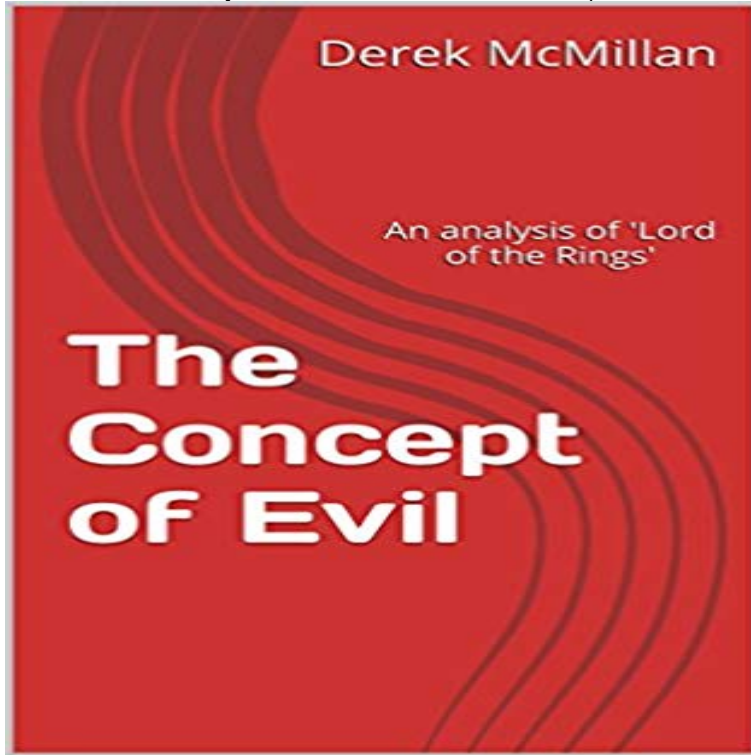


The Concept of Evil: An analysis of Lord of the Rings
