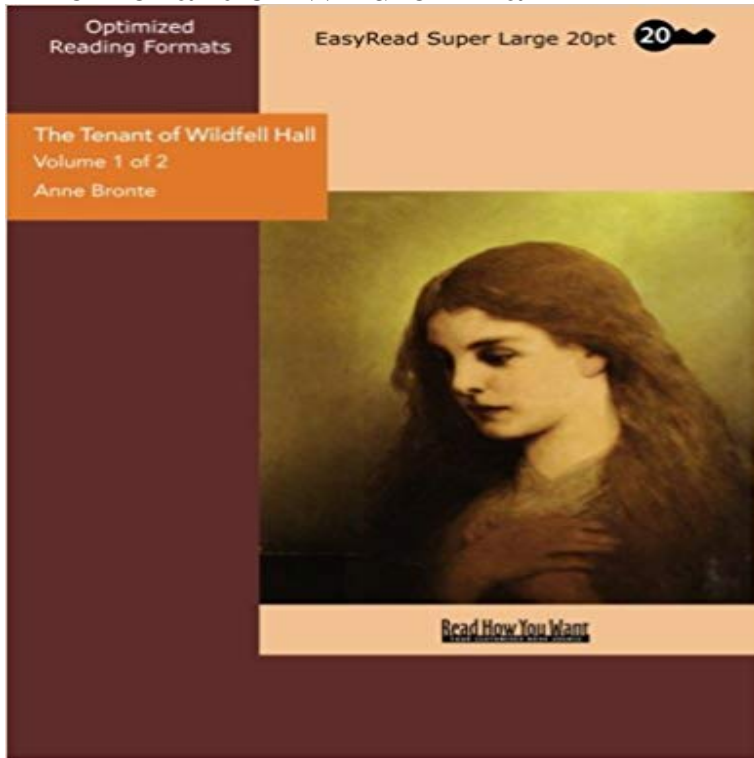


The Tenant of Wildfell Hall
