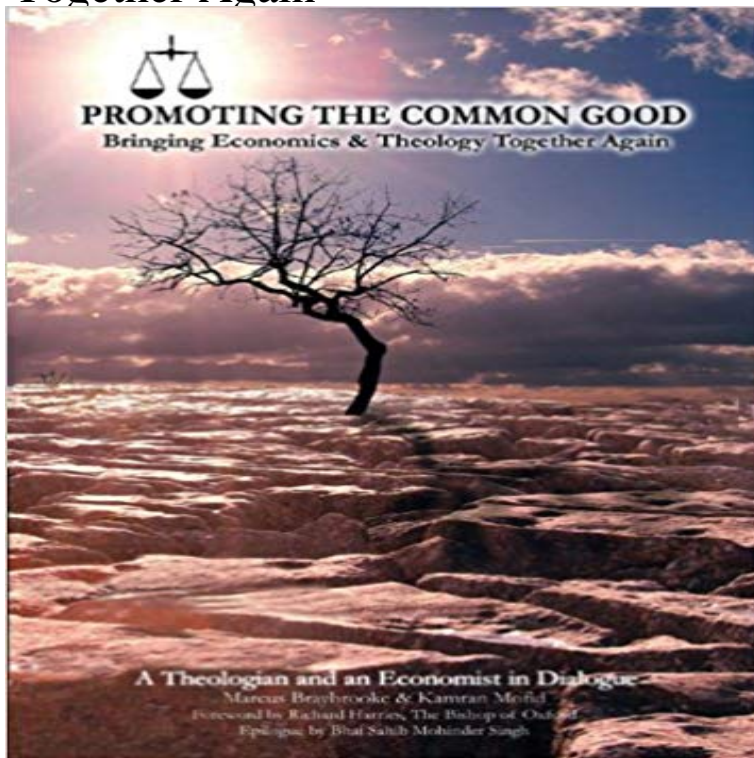


Promoting the Common Good: Bringing Economics and Theology Together Again
